

Accomplishments

- A child psychiatrist was hired to be available two days a week. The Youth and Family intake system was redesigned so that families may be seen face to face within five business days.
- Clarification of data and outcome reporting Work with the community in the development of a ten point plan to improve outcomes for Addison County families.
- Development and implementation with Porter and Bristol Internal Medicine for a Medication Assisted Treatment Program
- Expanded staffing resources to include the availability of services provided by individuals with the lived experience of mental illness. These peer services include: community outreach, supportive listening, emotional support; education; advocacy; transition support between hospital and community treatment settings; and social support. Multiple sources of support not only reduce a person's sense of isolation, but also increase their activity in the community, allowing them to obtain an integral role in society. Currently, we have peers working within our 17 Court Street and crisis team services.

 Open Dialogue meetings have been held with over 30 of our clients with their families and support networks.
